### SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- \* Exhibits 1-15 inclusive must be grown by the exhibitor.
- \* Decorative classes - Flowers not necessarily grown by exhibitor.
- \* Vases and bowls - A vase is defined as a vessel, the height of which is greater than the breadth and a bowl is a vessel, the breadth of which is greater than the height.
- \* Distinct - Each bloom is a different colour.
- \* NND - Not Necessarily Distinct - two or more blooms may be the same colour.
- \* The judging standards will be those used by the Horticultural Society

## FLORAL ART

- \* A floral saucer is a design of small flowers and/or foliage and/or berries. It should be arranged in sand and the saucer must be completely covered.
- \* A decorated saucer should consist of an arrangement of flowers and/or foliage and/or berries. The saucer need not be completely covered. Miniature flowers should be used in miniature arrangements.
- \* Dish or tray e.g. slice or lamington tray.
- \* Any embellishments allowed.
