GENERAL REGULATIONS 2023

For the comfort, safety and enjoyment of all persons, the Show Society advises that:

- Person gaining unauthorised access to the Showground and/or any of the Showground's specific areas may be liable for prosecution;
- Persons enter the Showground at their own risk and must take proper care of all things they bring onto the Showground, The Show Society is not liable for any loss or damage to personal property;
- Persons entering the Showground agree to be responsible for their own actions and indemnify the Show Society against any loss or liability, cost, expense or damages arising from or in relation to their acts or omissions;
- The Show Society reserves the right to inspect and/or search bags brought into or out of the Showground and search all persons, their clothing and other items of such persons;
- Persons causing a disturbance or refusing to comply with requests from the Show Society will be ejected from the Showground;
- The Show Society may eject a person from the Showground for unauthorised sales or hawking of goods and services;
- The Show Society may refuse admission to or eject persons from the Showground at its sole discretion;
- Persons entering the Showground must adhere to the Work Health & Safety legislation.
- Smoking is prohibited indoors and at all catering or public seating areas of the Showground, and where indicated by 'No Smoking' signage.
- Additional entry conditions and requirements may apply to ticketed events;
- Any ticket purchased to enable entry into the Showground or any particular area or event at the Showground cannot be exchanged or returned after purchase.
- A person entering the Showground maybe photographed, filmed, taped and/or subjected to monitoring by close circuit television and it is deemed that a person by entering the Showground consents to the Show Society or third parties appointed by the Show Society photographing, filming or taping. The Show Society or third parties appointed by the Show Society can broadcast, publish, licence and use any photographs, film, recordings or images without compensation. The Show Society, third parties and anyone acquiring from them a right to use the material are not liable to the subject for its use in any way. The Show Society strictly complies with the Workplace Surveillance Act 2005;
- Entry to the Showground does not guarantee automatic entry to all events and activities on the Showground during the period of entry;
- Parking is restricted to designated areas and vehicles must not block emergency egress doors or emergency vehicle access roads and are to give way to emergency vehicles;
- All accidents or emergencies are to be immediately reported to the Secretary's Office or authorised personnel.
- Persons must obey all signs, notices and directions given by the Show Society whilst at the Showground.

BIOSECURITY & ANIMAL HEALTH DECLARATIONS

Agricultural Show societies require exhibitors to complete a declaration on the health status of animals participating in shows as part of showground biosecurity and the Agricultural Show societies require exhibitors to complete a declaration on the health management of animal health.

Orange Show Society is aware that biosecurity is an important issue when you consider exhibiting your livestock at our show. We have endeavoured to provide an environment that is as pest and disease free as possible in a show environment.

However, while we continue to try to provide a safe environment for our exhibitors, you are ultimately responsible for your own biosecurity. You should make your own risk assessment of our facilities and act accordingly.

The following advice from Animal Health Australia may help you make valid decisions – Responsibility for biosecurity doesn't end when your livestock leave the farm gate. By implementing good management practices in your farming operation, you'll be playing an important role in protecting your region, and possibly the entire industry, from devastating disease outbreaks.

These practical measures will help ensure your biosecurity practices extend into the wider community:

Moving animals off your property -

- make sure your animals are fit to travel before loading.
- Diseased/injured animals should not be moved off property and if necessary you should seek veterinary attention. Supply a NVD/TSS and animal health declaration

Taking animals to shows -

- ensure pens/housing areas are clean before they enter
- feed and water your livestock separately, if possible never share equipment if you must, always clean and disinfect before and after use isolate any returning stock for 10 days to allow for weed seed elimination and signs of diseases and pests





LOOKING BACK ON THE ORANGE SHOW

A Brief History, by Historian and Honorary Life Member, Sue Milne

The Annual Show is one of the most popular and important functions in the life of a country town and for over a century, Orange has held a Show or its equivalent. The first of its kind, a ploughing match, is said to have been held in 1854 at what is now the Five Ways in East Orange, as recorded in the *BATHURST FREE PRESS* 16th June 1855. Priest's bullock team won first prize.



Following this event, interested locals gathered for "the purpose of forming something like an agricultural association" and prizes were agreed on for ploughing matches; the best three bucket samples of wheat and for one hundredweight (cwt) of potatoes. And so it was, the birth of the Orange Agricultural Association, with T.J. Lane as chair.

The 1856 match was held on J.A. Templer's ground. First prize for the ploughing match was won by Jabez Priest and he was awarded £10. By 1858, four shows had been held immediately opposite Peisley's Inn, now identified as the Victoria Hotel. In 1861, the 'Ploughing Match and Agricultural Show' included entries for horses, cattle and pigs as well as produce exhibits of potatoes, cabbages, parsnips, carrots, pumpkins, oats, maize and wheat.

These early years were held at several locations around the town before a semi- permanent home was found at what is now Wade Park in 1873. Shows continued to be held here for the next 36 years.

By 1904, Wade Park Recreational Grounds were also proving too small for the event, and in 1908, with some funds behind them from past successful shows, the committee were finally able to purchase some land - some 48 acres in Bletchington and the current site for the Show.

Many of the buildings were dismantled, removed to the new site, and put back together in time for the 1909 Show. Building began on the grandstand and the pavilion; however it would be

nearly four years before construction was completed. The move was not without controversy and in 1909 the Showmen decided to strike after a disagreement over 'rates of rental' and formed into a union. Eventually, an amicable agreement was reached with the Show President Mr. Michael Dalton and Show Secretary Mr. Walter Tanner.



Some of the more notable events of Show days gone by include:

1912 – First Airplane flight in Orange. Wizard Stone flew his Bleriot monoplane over the grounds much to the amazement of many and a fly-past took place on three occasions, one of which was just after the Grand Parade below. The Grandstand and main Pavilion were completed in time for this 1912 Jubilee Show and were packed as the record crowd came to see the 'new-fangled attractions.'

1914 – The 1914 Orange show continued during World War One. The showground was used from time to time by the Light Horse units for training.

1916 – Several ex-Light Horse soldiers mounted a tent pegging exhibition and showed off their skills at this 1916 show. Several wounded and repatriated soldiers were guests of the Show Committee and any serviceman in uniform was allowed free entry.

1919 – During World War One the Dalton Pavilion was constructed much to the relief of the section stewards who were to benefit from its completion.

1923 – Orange's Diamond Jubilee Show was held in what the Orange Leader newspaper described at the time as "unfavourable conditions." A special rail siding had been established near the grounds though many walked to the new showgrounds. A steam train made regular trips between Orange and the 'show' siding.

1925 – A major tragedy was witnessed by many show goers. Local pilot Tom Linn crashed his aeroplane (Avro 504K) in a paddock next door to the showground on Wednesday afternoon 29th April. The pilot and passenger were killed.

1930's – Rural Youth Clubs or Junior Farmers' Clubs exhibited at many of the shows and was a popular organization taking up large areas in the Orange Show pavilion with their impressively designed and executed displays.

1939 – Leading up to World War 2 the Showground was used by the sixth Light horse Troops for training camps. During the 1939 camp, the movie "Forty Thousand Horsemen" directed by Charles Chauvel was produced. The film tells the story of the Australian Light Horse cavalry which saw service in Sinai & Palestine Campaigns during WW1. One of the main actors was "Chips" Rafferty whose father, John Gaffage, had the License to Courthouse Hotel (1917) & Oriental Hotel (1920).

1941 – In 1941 the Orange Showgrounds was officially taken over by the Commonwealth of Australian Defence Department with Army troops moving onto the site for the duration. The Showground was used as an Internment camp for Italians enemy aliens as opposed to Prisoners of War.

1952 – The quality and variety of the agricultural displays at the Orange Show in the 1950's as better times returned. The first rodeo was held on the Orange Showgrounds after timber rodeo yards were constructed by Mr. Mark Sweeting on the northern side of the then ring.
1969 – Orange's 100th Show was opened at 3pm on Friday 25th April, 1969, by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's representative the British High Commissioner Sir Charles Johnson.

1983 – The feature of the 1983 show, the 114th, was the one-day rodeo which featured five premier rodeo events for the first time at an Orange Show.

1985 – A night show was held for the first time with sideshow alley all lit up. Saturday night fireworks were to be the new feature at the Orange Show.

1988 – The Orange Show this year was awarded a N.S.W. Bicentennial certificate for their Orange Australian Bicentennial Show held in April 1988. This also marked the year that the National Trust listed the Orange Showground site and put it on the Heritage List (Agricultural and Dalton Pavilions).

1995 – This year marked the return of the regular Orange Show after a break of several years. Orange Council unfortunately demolished the grandstand with little or no intention of replacing it. The tops of the cupolas were returned to the Orange Show Society were incorporated into the Showground Entrance Gates.

2007 – This show was affected by heavy rain with access to the showground being cut in half and the horse ring events cancelled due to the extremely muddy conditions.

2021 – Along with many others across the country, the Orange Show was cancelled in line with government health orders due to the global COVID-19 pandemic.

2022 – The show returned with renewed enthusiasm and volunteer base.

In connection with the 2023 Orange Show, the Orange Regional Museum will have an exhibition on The Regional Shows featuring stories, photographs, and articles from the local area. Please be sure to visit and explore the exhibit at the museum as well as the display in the William's Pavilion.

The Orange Show continues each year with the assistance of many volunteers who coordinate livestock and pavilion sections, entertainment and trade stalls, administration and much more. The Show Society works with local organisations such as RFS, Scouts and SES who provide support for the operation of the show in return for a financial contribution. Local organisations, and individuals also provide a much needed financial boost to the Orange Show through sponsorships and donations, keeping the history alive. The Orange Show Society welcomes and values your continued patronage so the show continues into the future.


