- Please retain your entry form for collection of your article.
- Exhibits and prizemoney must be collected on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> April from the Agricultural Pavilion at 6pm.
- No responsibility is taken for exhibits not collected within this time.
- Any unclaimed prizes will revert to the Orange Show Society.

## Hints & Tips on Exhibiting Vegetables

- It is important that the fruit or vegetable has reached maturity, perhaps more important that it has not passed its peak.
- Most fruit and vegetables are best picked on the same day as delivery. This is particularly important with leaf vegetables.
- Some fruit and vegetables such as onions and pumpkins can be picked when they
  are at their best and stored if handled properly.
- When choosing which fruit or vegetables to show, remember a good, even colour that is true to the variety and without blemishes is important.
- For classes where more than one of the same variety is required try to choose fruit or vegetables with uniform size, shape and colour.

Stating the name of the variety of fruit or vegetable you have grown is an advantage for individual characteristics.
